

The Alumetallic units. which are made from a sheet of glass over a panel of metal, are sited on either side of the extractor to create a sense of symmetry. The doors are held in place by a cushioned hinge when opened so items can be put away with ease. Task lighting has been integrated under the wall units to provide illumination for preparing meals, while slightly bowed handles mimic the curve of the furniture below. ike many people who begin planning a new kitchen, Amanda Tompkins and her husband soon realised that to achieve their ideal open-plan scheme, they would have to extend their property. 'We moved in to our mock-Tudor house seven years ago and although the kitchen was a nice size and bigger than the usual galley style, it still wasn't large enough for entertaining,' recalls Amanda, mum to Megan, 13, and Millie, 11.

'The old kitchen had shiny oak units, which made the room seem quite orange, and wall tiles with ducks on,' she continues. 'While we were saving up for the ground-floor extension, I tried to update the kitchen by changing the handles and tiling over the splashback."

Amanda and her husband decided that the new space needed to allow as much daylight in as possible, so although their drawings included knocking down a conservatory, they decided to add a large skylight and patio doors that would lead to the garden instead. 'We wanted to feel as if we were living in the garden and be able to spill out onto the decking and lawn during the warmer months,' explains Amanda.

While the extension was being built by Dan Sullivan at Sullivan Brothers Construction, Amanda started to spend time thinking about the sort of scheme she wanted to install. 'The last three kitchens I'd had were all wooden, so I fancied having something a bit more contemporary, which would also be conducive to entertaining,' she says. 'It was while I was having coffee with a friend that I saw her new black and white scheme, which was designed by C & C Kitchens, and I knew then that a two-tone look was what I was after.'

Amanda and her husband went to visit the C & C showroom shortly after and were introduced to designer Michael Pearcy. He was so friendly and keen to help us achieve the modern look we wanted,' recalls Amanda. In between visits to the showroom, Amanda found a black and white Second Nature kitchen, which had some zebrano-effect hi-gloss, in a magazine and although she had decided that she didn't want to have another wooden kitchen, she couldn't stop looking at it. Finally, she showed the page to Michael who said he would send for a panel of the glossy material so that the couple could look at it next to the white units they liked. 'As soon as Michael took it out of the packaging I knew it



would look lovely as a trim around the top of the base units, so we went for it,' recalls Amanda.

When it came to choosing their appliances, the couple had their hearts set on an American-style fridge freezer to give them plenty of cool storage and for when they entertain, a neat bank of ovens and a coffee machine.

With the addition of a stunning glossy island in the same zebrano-effect panels as the decorative drawers, the Tompkins have created a beautiful room for their family, whether they are grabbing breakfast or chilling out, 'It's ironic that we do a lot of entertaining, as I don't actually do an awful lot of cooking,' smiles Amanda. 'Our kitchen is the perfect place to welcome guests and the living room is almost redundant. That will have to be my next project.'

Two slim wine coolers have been integrated into Amanda's island. Michael suggested having one for each type of wine and he found me these super, tiny chillers and mounted the doors in the centre so they look like a single large appliance, she explains


